sermon in the Gaelic Church on

The painters are commenced
to the Brewhing room flat ~~and~~
this morn^g so that we are kept
busy and I have not time to write.
Lady Leath's sister wishes to come
into morrow if I could take her.

The Miss Mc Gibbins have not been
in town for two years yet they
drove up to the door when they arrived.
Is not the Lord a promise keeping
as well as a promise making God,

may we acknowledge him in all our
way and he will assuredly direct our
steps, I have just been planning
that if we get the back room kept
for you in winter to have a letter
box in the door to prevent the ring-
ing of bell as much as possible,
Mr. Morrison got away the Area Gate
to put hinges on it some two or
three week ago and he has not thought
proper to bring back yet.

I fear I must make an effort to get
to the country a while whether I will
or not, but when or where to go I know
not, Is there any word of Aunt getting
her house let I forgot to ask you,
